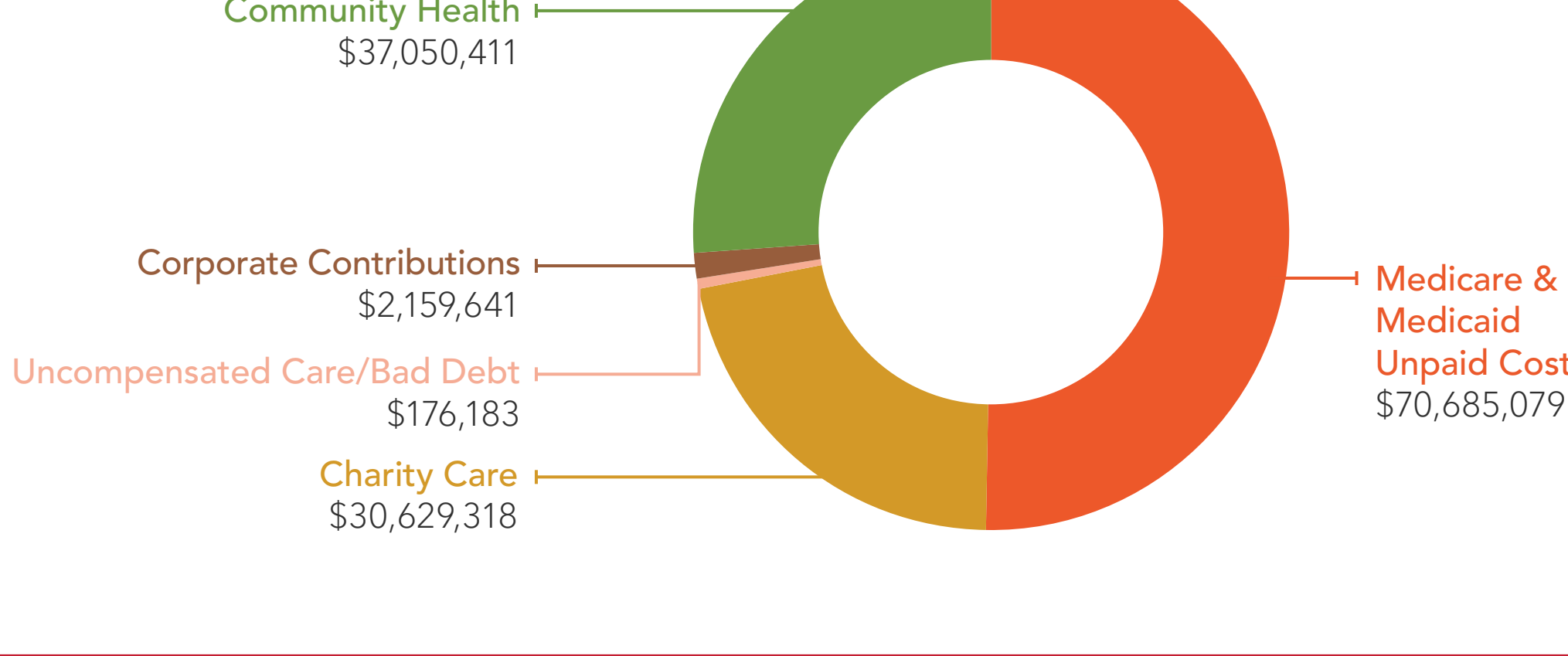

Addressing Community Needs

Carle's Community Benefit Implementation Plan is intended to address needs identified by the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) conducted in Champaign-Urbana in 2014. While there are a number of additional needs as identified by data and input from community leaders, these four health areas were selected as **top priorities**:



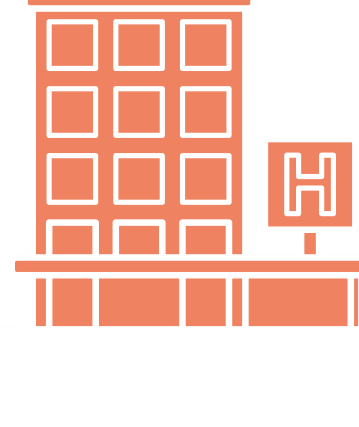
1 Access to Care

Carle has sought ways to initiate and expand healthcare services for the underinsured and uninsured by working collaboratively with community organizations and leaders.

COMMUNITY CLINIC SUPPORT

\$446,723

to Promise Healthcare at Frances Nelson Health Center to enhance services and access to care, including funding, leadership support, patient care services, supplies and more.



PHYSICIAN RECRUITMENT

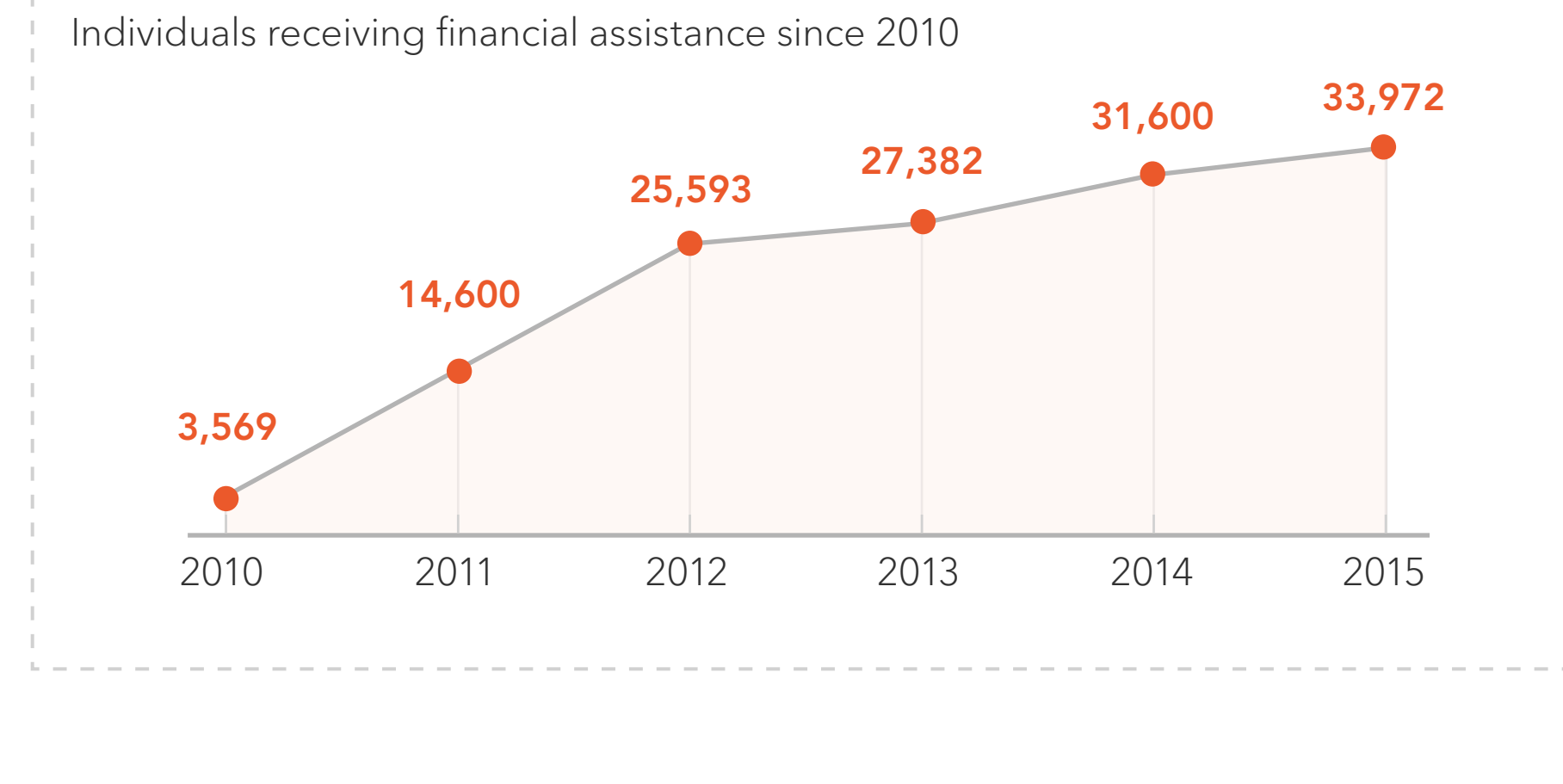
65 new providers

hired in 2015, with plans to recruit 24 primary care and 48 specialty care physicians in 2016.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

\$30.6 million

in free or discounted care for nearly **34,000 patients**



2 Behavioral Health

Behavioral Health is a predominant need in the region, and more specifically this year, drug abuse and addiction. In 2015, Carle partnered with law enforcement and other agencies to address this growing problem.

NARCAN

In July 2015, Carle partnered with the Champaign County Sheriff's Office to train and equip all local officers with Narcan, or naloxone, a medication administered through the nose that stops an opioid overdose as it's happening.

DRUG COURT

Through a partnership with Champaign County Drug Court and the Prairie Center, Carle helped pilot a voluntary drug treatment program. Participants receive monthly doses of Vivitrol, a medication that neutralizes the high and reduces drug cravings, as well as cognitive behavioral therapy from the Prairie Center.

3 Obesity

Carle continues to support activities aimed at improving the health of families throughout the community, including support of two local chapters of Girls on the Run - Champaign County and East Central Illinois. This international program has a mission to help young women become physically stronger and build their self-esteem.

CHAMPAIGN COUNTY

221 girls served in 2015 at **11 sites**, with more than **600 participants** including coaches, family, and community members joining in the bi-annual 5K.

EAST CENTRAL ILLINOIS (COLES COUNTY & BEYOND)

437 girls served in 2015 at **24 sites**, with more than **1,000 participants** including coaches, family, and community members joining in the bi-annual 5K.



4 Violence

Carle is dedicated to the safety of victims, including victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and child abuse.

CHILD ABUSE SAFETY TEAM (CAST)

1,300 hours

since 2012, logged by one pediatric physician who identifies suspected abuse, and ensures proper testing and investigation.

95 children

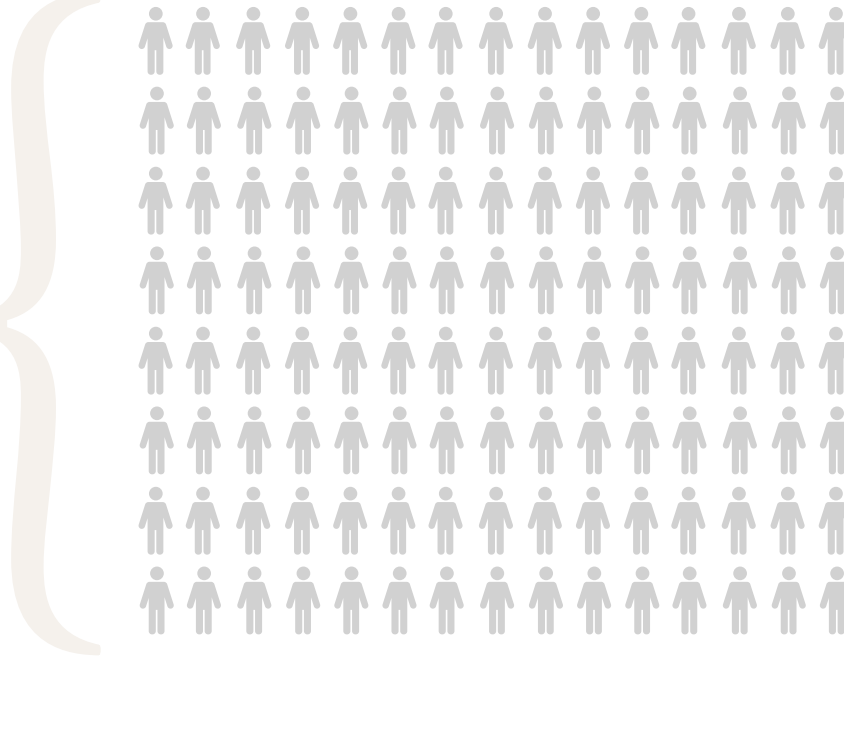
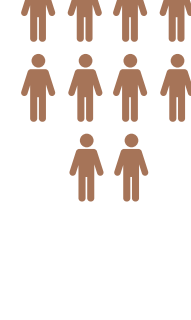
protected through CAST in 2015, and more than 280 kids total since the program started in 2012.
